**Shenandoah Community Foundation Awards \$45,000 to
Shenandoah County Free Clinic**

Woodstock, VA -- The Shenandoah Community Foundation recently awarded a total of \$45,000 to the Capital Building Campaign of the Shenandoah County Free Clinic. The grant monies came from three donor-advised funds maintained by the Foundation: the Dr. Jacob and Diane Haun Fund, the William C. "Ches" and Evelyn E. Lambert Memorial Fund, and the Donald H. Albright Fund.

The recent grants were in addition to an earlier \$5,000 grant awarded to the Clinic this past spring through the Woodstock Anonymous Fund.

"We are honored to be able to support the tremendous work of the Shenandoah County Free Clinic and are grateful to our donors for their generosity," said Foundation President, Jeff Dalke.

Dalke continued, "The great thing about these grants is that they came from 'donor-advised funds' that were established years ago. When the donors started their Funds they didn't know what worthy causes might arise in the future. But this year, when the Free Clinic was raising money for its Building Campaign, the donors were able to recommend that money from their Funds be used for this cause."

"There's no worthier cause than the Free Clinic, and I am very happy to be able to support the Clinic in this way," said Dr. Jacob Haun, Vice President of the Foundation and donor of the Dr. Jacob and Diane Haun Fund.

The Shenandoah Community Foundation is a non-profit 501 (c) (3) organization whose mission is to connect people who care with causes that matter. The Foundation currently maintains more than 45 Funds, including scholarship, memorial, donor-advised, field of interest, unrestricted, and agency funds.

Anyone can start a Fund by contributing \$5,000 or by starting with a seed donation as low as \$500. People with a similar vision can pool their resources to establish a Fund. Once a Fund is established, anyone can donate to it at any time in any amount.
