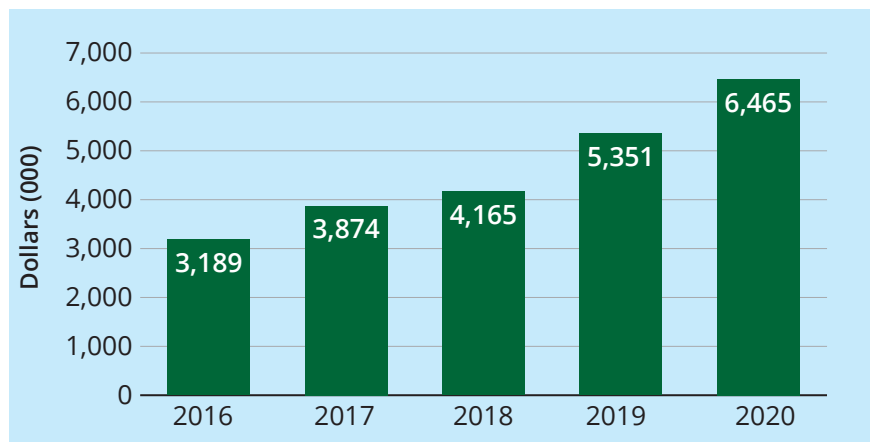

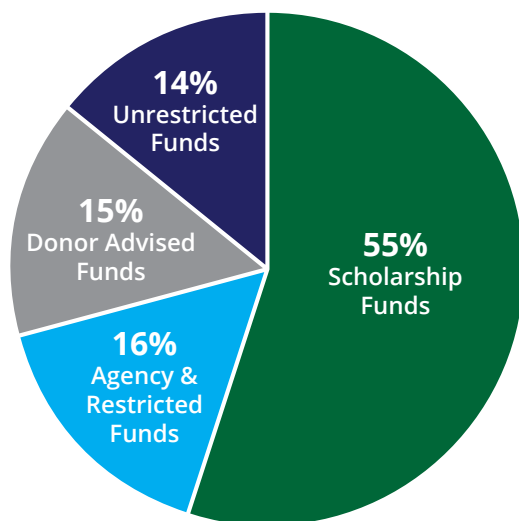

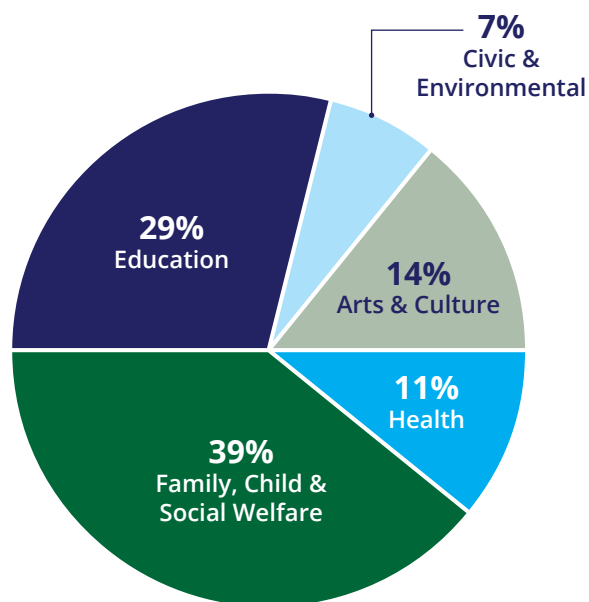
### Total Assets \$6.5 million

# MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Fund Sponsors and Friends of the Foundation,

No matter how you spin it, 2020 was a year of uncertainty, concern, and sorrow for many. Words and phrases like isolation, social distancing, contact tracing, quarantine, and panic shopping took on new meaning. For many, it was the worst year of our lives.

Yet in the midst of such turmoil, we saw the people of Shenandoah County remain deeply caring and generous when it comes to helping their neighbors.

Our nurses, doctors, and first responders never stopped working, despite personal risk of contracting the deadly virus. Daycare workers opened their doors for the children of essential workers. Volunteers continued to assist the most vulnerable members of our community in many ways. Our schools distributed food for families of children. And our churches opened their doors to students who needed a place to study. We could say much more about the many caring hands of the community non-profits and generous supporters who helped us survive the pandemic.

Our community was generous with its support through the Shenandoah Community Foundation. As early as March 2020, the Foundation was able to respond directly to the crisis by establishing a Covid-19 Emergency Fund for Shenandoah County to assist with food, housing, utilities, daycare, and other critical needs. The community's response was extraordinary with contributions to this Fund exceeding \$180,000. Our Executive Committee

met an unprecedented 23 times during 2020 to review applications and award over \$147,000 from the Fund. We have continued to receive applications and disburse Covid-related funds in 2021.

While few activities were normal in 2020, we attempted to maintain the ongoing activity of the Foundation as best we could. The Foundation awarded over \$380,000 to deserving students and organizations. It was indeed a record accomplishment.

In addition to Covid-related grants, these awards included 75 scholarships totaling almost \$97,000 to students who will attend college and vocational schools. And over \$138,000 in grants were given to nonprofit organizations for their outstanding work in our communities.

Donors created five new funds bringing our total portfolio of funds to 79. (See a description of the new funds on page 10). At the end of 2020, assets of the Foundation were \$6.4 million, a 21% increase over year end 2019.

Looking ahead, the Foundation offers opportunities for us to play larger roles for charitable giving in the County. All of us can review our financial and gift planning for the coming year and consider the benefits of creating a fund with the Foundation. The reason the Foundation exists is summarized in our slogan, "connecting people who care with causes that matter." We are here to help you accomplish your goals.

## COMMUNITY RESPONSE TO COVID-19 CRISIS



The CDC declared that COVID-19 was heading toward pandemic status on February 25, 2020. In the following year, the virus dominated much of the news and brought schools, many businesses, and normal activities to a standstill.

Concerned about the welfare of our Shenandoah County residents, the directors of the Foundation reacted with lightning speed, and at a special meeting of the board, they established the COVID-19 Emergency Relief Fund for Shenandoah County. The Foundation seeded the Fund with \$35,000 that was made possible through the generosity of a legacy gift from Dr. Jacob Haun and Diane Gardner-Haun.

Within one day, the Fund grew to over \$100,000 with major donations from local businesses and individuals, and by the end of the year, many citizens helped their neighbors with donations totaling more than \$182,000.

Before Congress passed the largest economic recovery package in history (CARES Act), the immediate needs of individuals who had lost jobs or encountered illness were met by the selfless and hardworking nonprofit groups serving Shenandoah County residents.

The Foundation distributed \$147,000 in grants to twenty-four local nonprofit organizations in 2020. The grants provided funding for food, prescriptions, and other essential items; rental assistance, utilities, and transportation; emergency protective equipment and sanitizing supplies; and daycare for essential workers.

As the virus lingered, additional needs emerged for educational assistance and supervision for students during school closures and upgraded technology for continuity of service for the nonprofit groups themselves.

We hope this is a once-in-a-lifetime event, but regardless, we know we can count on our Shenandoah County neighbors when help is needed!

# MAKING A DIFFERENCE

## SHARON AND DENNIS LILLY

As long-time and generous supporters of 4-H programs in Shenandoah County, Sharon and Dennis Lilly are familiar names and faces. Sharon grew up in Shenandoah County's 4-H program and credits Sally Gochenour, the Extension Home Economist at the time, for teaching her how to sew. Today, Sharon's name is prominently displayed on the 4-H building that opened in 2008 at the Shenandoah County Fairgrounds.

When Dennis overheard 4-H volunteers talking during a livestock sale about how crowded it was in the old show barn, Dennis asked how much it would cost to build a new facility. That started the ball rolling to get the new arena built, with the Lillys contributing a significant amount to the effort.

The Lillys have also been ardent supporters for scholarships for 4-H and FFA college and vocational school students. During the annual 4-H/FFA Dairy Show, a gallon of milk from the champion dairy cow is auctioned to raise money for these scholarships, and for many years, the highest bidder has been Lilly Trucking, owned by the Lillys before they retired. The winning bid was typically several thousand dollars, adding significantly to the scholarship fund.

This year, the Lillys became even more involved in providing scholarships for 4-H participants when they established a separate fund with Shenandoah Community Foundation. The Sharon and Dennis Lilly 4-H Scholarship Fund will provide an annual award to a graduating student from Shenandoah County who has been a member of a Shenandoah County 4-H Club, Council or Chapter.

Public, private, and home-schooled students are invited to apply for the scholarship. The first award will be made in 2021. Applications are available through 4-H or online at [shenandoahcommunityfoundation.org](http://shenandoahcommunityfoundation.org).

## FAQ

### What is the purpose of a Community Foundation?

Community Foundations are tax-exempt, public charities with a mission to promote philanthropy and improve the quality of life for residents in their communities.

Shenandoah Community Foundation invests and administers charitable funds established by people who want to help the region meet its unique needs.

### Why should I consider starting a fund?

You can make a difference in Shenandoah County for years to come and create a legacy of giving, specific to your charitable intent. Perhaps you want to honor a loved one with a scholarship fund or support a specific charitable cause with an agency fund. Donor advised funds are a unique type of fund that enable you to make a charitable contribution, receive an immediate tax deduction, then recommend grants from the fund over time.

### Why would I consider a donor-advised fund rather than simply writing a check directly to a charitable organization?

If you're facing a taxable event, such as the sale of real estate, a business, or highly appreciated stock, you may be eligible to receive a current-year tax deduction\* and extend your giving over multiple years from the assets in your fund.

### How do I start a charitable fund?

Identify what matters to you—perhaps it's a cause, a charitable organization, or someone you want to honor.

Meet with a Shenandoah Community Foundation representative to design the fund so it can achieve your goals.

Create a name for your fund, and offer a tax-deductible gift to your fund now or through your estate.

As your fund is invested for long-term growth, watch the meaningful difference your giving makes as you support your favorite causes.

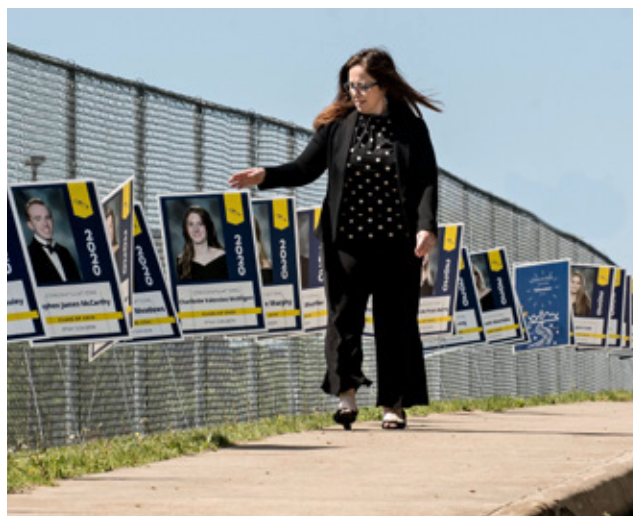

## Jeffrey A. Dalke Administrative Endowment Fund



This Fund was established by Dr. Jerry and Vicky Germroth to honor Jeff Dalke, a long-time Director of the Board who has selflessly served the Foundation in multiple capacities, including Board president and currently as treasurer. The purpose of the Fund is to pay administrative and operational costs of the Foundation.

## COVID-19 Emergency Relief Fund for Shenandoah County



The Covid emergency fund was established to make grants to local charities and government organizations and entities to enable them to meet the needs of community members who have been impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic. These might include low income families experiencing short-term financial crises, residents who cannot obtain adequate food, those who have no medical insurance or who are underinsured, residents who lack access to paid sick days, neighbors who are self-quarantined without sufficient support from their families and friends, and healthcare workers who require additional support for themselves and their families.

## Milt and Mattie Pence Cemetery Fund

To honor his parents, Donald M. Pence established the Milt and Mattie Pence Cemetery Fund to help maintain the Union Forge Cemetery at Union Forge United Methodist Church in Edinburg. Following the passing of Don in 2019, the bequest from his estate was transferred to this fund.

## Sharon and Dennis Lilly Scholarship Fund



With the generosity of Sharon and Dennis Lilly, this scholarship fund was established to provide an annual award to a graduating student from Shenandoah County who has been a member of a Shenandoah County 4-H Club, Council or Chapter.



## Vietnam Veterans of America, Chapter 936 Scholarship Fund

Chapter 936 of the Vietnam Veterans of America was chartered in 2004 with the objective to enhance the general social, economic, cultural, and physical condition of Vietnam era veterans in the Shenandoah Valley area. The organization has been awarding scholarships to children of Vietnam Veterans for several years, and made the decision to start a scholarship fund with the Foundation to help ensure the scholarships will continue in perpetuity.

Students from Shenandoah County, including those who attend public or private schools or are homeschooled, will be able to apply for a scholarship for college or vocational school if they have a living relative or an ancestor who was a Vietnam veteran.



## 2020 GRANTS

A primary focus of Shenandoah Community Foundation is to positively impact the quality of life in Shenandoah County. In 2020, a total of \$381,701 went back to our community in the form of grants and scholarships in the areas of Covid-19 emergency funds; education; family, child, and social services; health; civic affairs; arts and culture; and the environment.
