FOCUSED GIVING WITH LASTING IMPACT

This approach provides adaptability as community needs evolve, while still honoring your philanthropic priorities.

Currently, the Shenandoah Community Foundation is proud to steward five field-of-interest funds, each addressing vital aspects of community life.

- Endowment for Environmental Conservation – Protecting and preserving natural resources for future generations.
- John and Susan Hunsaker Children's Support Fund – Supporting the needs of elementary and middle school students in Shenandoah County.
- Career and Technical Education Fund – Expanding pathways for workforce readiness and lifelong success.
- Bowman-Shannon Cultural Arts Fund – Enriching our community through creativity and expression.
- The Art Group Fund – Investing in educators who inspire the next generation of artists.

These funds strengthen the foundation's grantmaking power and allow the community to pool resources from multiple donors who share similar passions. Together, we can respond to emerging challenges and amplify the impact of every dollar.

SPRING HAPPY HOUR: PHILANTHROPY AND THE NEXT GENERATION



In early spring, we welcomed young and mid-career professionals for a conversation about the role of philanthropy in shaping our community's future. Attendees discussed how continued, invested contributions, whether of time, talent, or treasure, can create lasting change. It was an evening of networking, learning, and envisioning what's possible when emerging leaders commit to giving back. The event was made possible by Community Support Sponsor, First Bank.

NONPROFIT COFFEE AND CONVERSATIONS

Later in the season, leaders from more than 20 local nonprofits gathered for an informal morning of discussion and connection. Over coffee, participants shared the challenges they face and explored opportunities for collective solutions. The energy in the room was inspiring, proof that when organizations come together, they can amplify their impact and strengthen the entire nonprofit sector. This event has led to new partnerships and collaborative approaches.

FUND HOLDER AND DONOR BREAKFAST

In the fall, we brought together fund holders and donors for an in-depth conversation about how the foundation invests resources and the impact those investments are making in our community. This event provided a meaningful forum for donors to connect with one another, share ideas, and learn more about the collective power of their philanthropy. It was a celebration of transparency, trust, and the shared vision that drives our work.

"It can sometimes be difficult to fully describe the continued need of a renewal project like our housing stability assistance program, where the real impact is often best seen in the quiet but powerful ways it changes daily life. Small supports often carried big weight. For example, helping to cover dental care allowed an individual to resolve ongoing pain and infection, treatment that meant fewer missed workdays and the ability to keep steady employment. Each intervention prevented a loss, either of housing, of essential utilities, or of basic dignity, that could have triggered a cycle of instability." - **Shenandoah Alliance for Shelter**

The community foundation's grantmaking continued to make a meaningful impact in 2025, with \$401,225 awarded to organizations working to serve, uplift, and improve Shenandoah County and beyond.

COMMUNITY GRANTS AT WORK



In December, community foundation staff had the opportunity to meet Wendy, a veteran, former local educator, and Woodstock resident. Blue Ridge Habitat for Humanity invited us to come visit as they completed some projects at Wendy's home. Habitat was able to layer funding from the Shenandoah Community Foundation and Woodstock Rotary with resources and volunteers from Team Rubicon to renovate the bathroom and install a stair chair and ramp. This didn't just increase accessibility for Wendy, but reduced the stress and concern for their whole family.
